The report of social audit shows that Agahe Pakistan is strongly committed towards the implementation of universal standards of social performance management; the compliance level of Agahe Pakistan towards USSPM is found to be 66% in this Social Audit.



The Scooty is given to Ms. Zahida Bibi from Vehari I Branch, district Vehari. "Women are a part of society we can no longer have them sit at home it is important that we make it easier for them to work by providing them safe transport and breaking the cultural barriers".

### From the Field

Tariq Faridi, resident of village Basti Khawaja district Rajanpur, had faced abject poverty in his life. He had difficulties securing a steady stream of income, but he worked hard and never gave up. He used to spend most of his time working in his fish shop, but despite that, he earned only Rs.6000 a month, an amount that was insufficient for his household needs and for the expenses associated with sending his 4 children to school

He did not want his poverty to affect his children's education; he had already seen his siblings' children grow up working to support their parents rather than go to school. His fish selling business was seasonal as the winter ended his sale used to become less. He wanted to diversify his shop to add chicken meet along with fish but he had not enough money for it.



One day he was advised from his friend to take loan from AGAHE Pakistan Interest Free Loan Program. He further enquired about loan and its process then he approached concerned officer and received the loan Rs. 20000.

With this amount, He purchased a number of Chicken as well as meat processing machine. This diversification, leg a good change in his sale and he perceived that his income has increased. This meant that he could run his business all year long.

Now he is running his shop successfully as he has hired an employee on daily wage of Rs.300. He spends his time with his family and His school going children and sufficient household income make him satisfied and happy.
